WEATHER POLICY

The Muni may interrupt a show for a maximum of 30 minutes before cancellation. If a show has played for a total of 1 hour, rain checks will not be issued. If a show is cancelled and has not played for a total of 1 hour or to intermission, retain your ticket stub. Your reserved seat ticket stub may be exchanged for a seat at a subsequent performance. However, the same seat location is not guaranteed. Patrons holding General Admission tickets may retain their ticket stub or obtain rain checks before leaving the theater. s the sun sets, the curtain rises on warm summer nights at The Muni, a summer tradition for 69 years. Welcome to our 2019 season of "Broadway under the Stars!"

Originally conceived on April 21, 1950, as a not-for-profit theatrical organization, the Springfield Municipal Opera Association transformed a 55-acre wheat field into an outdoor amphitheater.

On opening night, June 17, 1950, thousands of people turned out to see our first production, the operetta *The Merry Widow*.

The Muni, as we became affectionately known, flourished until a series of setbacks in the mid-1950s. A major fire in 1963 destroyed part of the facilities, and another fire destroyed what was left the following year.

With hopes for a rebirth, a test production of *Bye, Bye, Birdie!* was staged in Douglas Park in 1964. The response was so enthusiastic that The Muni was able to rebuild its facility and return to the lake site theater in 1965.

With continued support from our enthusiastic audiences and our dedicated corps of volunteers, The Muni has continued to flourish, becoming one of the largest community theatres in the Midwest. Lavish settings, dazzling costumes and a full orchestra, all are presented under a canopy of twinkling stars. Each summer our audience continues to grow, as we entertain the very best in musical theatre. From families with young children, to teens on dates, or their grandparents, everyone is at home at The Muni.

We hope you enjoy the show.

Young Based on the 1967 Academy Award-winning film, *Thoroughly Modern Millie* takes you back to the height of the Jazz Age in New York City, when "moderns" including a flapper named Millie Dillmount, were bobbing their hair, raising their hemlines, entering the workforce and rewriting the rules of love. This high-spirited musical romp is a delightful valentine to the long-standing spirit of New York City and the people who seek to discover themselves there.

Set in New York City in 1922, *Thoroughly Modern Millie* tells the story of young Millie Dillmount from Kansas, who comes to New York in search of a new life for herself. Her grand plan is to find a job as a secretary for a wealthy man and then marry him. However, her plan goes completely awry. The owner of her dingy hotel kidnaps young girls to sell to the Far East, her wealthy boss is slow in proposing marriage, and the man she actually falls in love with doesn't have a dime to his name...or so he tells her.

AUTHORS

Richard Henry Morris was nominated for the 2002 Tony Award (Best Book) and the 2002 Drama Desk Award (Best Book) for his work on *Thoroughly Modern Millie*, the Tony and Drama Desk award winning Best Musical of 2002. *Thoroughly Modern Millie* has brought heartfelt joy to audiences in Australia, South Africa and Japan and it currently is being performed in regional, community, college and high school theaters across the globe. *Thoroughly Modern Millie* is the stage adaptation of the original Universal film solely created and written by Richard Morris. Mr. Morris won the prestigious Writers Guild of America Award for the motion picture as Best American Musical and the film received seven Academy Award nominations and five Golden Globe nominations.

Dick Scanlan co-wrote and co-directed *Whorl Inside a Loop Off-Broadway* at Second Stage, inspired by his experiences volunteering at a men's prison. He co-authored *Everyday Rapture*, a critically acclaimed musical written with and for Sherie Rene Scott, produced on Broadway at the American Airlines Theatre by The Roundabout Theatre Company, and Off-Broadway at Second Stage. He wrote the book and lyrics for 2002's Tony and Drama Desk Award Winning Best Musical, *Thoroughly Modern Millie*, music by Jeanine Tesori.

Jeanine Tessori won the Tony Award for Best Original Score with Lisa Kron for the musical *Fun Home*. She has also written Tony-nominated scores for *Twelfth Night* at Lincoln Center; *Thoroughly Modern Millie* (lyrics, Dick Scanlan); *Caroline, or Change* (lyrics, Tony Kushner); and *Shrek The Musical* (lyrics, David Lindsay-Abaire). The production of *Caroline, or Change* at the National Theatre in London received the Olivier Award for Best New Musical. Her 1997 Off-Broadway musical *Violet* (lyrics, Brian Crawley) opened on Broadway in 2014 and garnered four Tony nominations, including Best Musical Revival.

A fundamental principle in improv comedy is the concept of "yes, and". When someone in a scene states something, you trust and accept it as truth and build on the reality that has been set. If a scene partner says, "the sky is yellow," by following this principle, your response could then be, "yes, and the clouds are purple." Boiled down, it's as simple as agreeing, trusting, saying yes.

Morgan has called Andrew more times in the last year than she would care to admit to propose they direct another show. Thankfully, Andrew's response has been "yes, and..." Putting together a show is a process that requires a tremendous amount of trust, between staff members, between the cast and staff, between the crew and cast, and dozens of other combinations. This same concept of trust is placed in the hands of audience members. Accepting the suspension of disbelief that the Muni stage is now Manhattan of the 1920s, sitting back and taking in a show is how the audience communicates to the cast, "ok, we're in this with you. What you say, goes."

We would like to thank our incredible cast and staff for helping bring this favorite to life in its Muni Debut. We would also like to thank the Muni Board of Directors, Managers and Trustees for trusting us to take on another show.

And to our audiences, thank you for supporting the arts and the Springfield Muni Opera. Thanks for saying "yes, and..."

Kevin Zepp (Lighting Designer/






