s the sun sets, the curtain rises on warm summer nights at The Muni, a summer tradition for 72 years. Welcome to our 2022 season of "Broadway under the Stars!"

Originally conceived on April 21, 1950, as a not-for-profit theatrical organization, the Springfield Municipal Opera Association transformed a 55-acre wheat field into an outdoor amphitheater.

On opening night, June 17, 1950, thousands of people turned out to see our first production, the operetta *The Merry Widow*.

The Muni, as we became affectionately known, flourished until a series of setbacks in the mid-1950s. A major fire in 1963 destroyed part of the facilities, and another fire destroyed what was left the following year.

With hopes for a rebirth, a test production of *Bye, Bye, Birdie!* was staged in Douglas Park in 1964. The response was so enthusiastic that The Muni was able to rebuild its facility and return to the lake site theater in 1965.

With continued support from our enthusiastic audiences and our dedicated corps of volunteers, The Muni has continued to flourish, becoming one of the largest community theatres in the Midwest. Lavish settings, dazzling costumes and a full orchestra, all are presented under a canopy of twinkling stars. Each summer our audience continues to grow, as we entertain the very best in musical theatre. From families with young children, to teens on dates, or their grandparents, everyone is at home at The Muni.

#### **AUTHORS**

**Terrence McNally** had a remarkably far-ranging career, including a new work on Broadway in each of the last six decades. In 2018 he was inducted into the American Academy of Arts and Letters. He is a 2019 recipient of a Special Tony Award for Lifetime Achievement. He also received the Dramatists Guild Lifetime Achievement Award and the Lucille Lortel Lifetime Achievement Award. He won four Tony Awards for his plays *Love! Valour! Compassion!* and *Master Class* and his musical books for *Kiss of the Spider Woman* and *Ragtime*. In 1996 he was inducted into the Theater Hall of Fame.

**Stephen Flaherty** is the composer of the Broadway musicals *Ragtime* (Tony, Drama Desk, OCC Awards, two Grammy nominations), *Seussical* (Grammy, Drama Desk nominations), *Once on This Island* (Tony nomination, Olivier Award, Best Musical) and *Rocky*. This year celebrates Stephen's 32-year collaboration with lyricist-librettist Lynn Ahrens. Stephen and Lynn are members of the Dramatists Guild Council and co- founders of the Dramatists Guild Fellows Program. In 2015 they were inducted into the Theater Hall Of Fame.

**Lynn Ahrens** won Tony, Drama Desk and Outer Critics Circle Awards and received two Grammy nominations for Broadway's *Ragtime*. She and longtime collaborator Stephen Flaherty received the Oscar Hammerstein Award for Lifetime Achievement, and in 2015 they were inducted into the Theater Hall of Fame. *Broadway: Anastasia; Once On This Island* (Olivier Award, Best Musical; Tony nominations, Best Book and Score); *Seussical* (Grammy nomination); *Ragtime* (2010 Broadway revival). She is a Council member of the Dramatists Guild of America, a co-founder of the Dramatists Guild Fellows Program, and a Lilly Award winner for Lyrics.

director's note

"In 1902 Father built a house at the crest of the Broadview Avenue hill in New Rochelle, New York..."

The earliest date mentioned in *Ragtime* is 1902, only 120 years difference between our present time. It is all but surprising at how little has changed. When we remind ourselves that the United States of America is only 245 years old, it is even more sobering.

When I applied to direct *Ragtime* in 2020, I thought it was a tremendous opportunity to direct, learn, and share with the community. I felt pride in being selected for this responsibility. (Un)Fortunately (depending how you look at it), COVID-19 required us to take immediate action to close. Even though many people were quarantining around the globe, we saw that racism, xenophobia, and various other forms of hatred still were able to prosper. Not only did we suffer major division amongst our neighborhoods and nation, we suffered and witnessed people being killed, many of them Black.

While we were putting this show together, many of us were grieving and coming to terms with realities. What we have seen and experienced cannot be simply forgotten, it must be worked through. To be frank, seeing the same type of trauma over and over again doesn't desensitize us to it. Mostly, we just start part of the cycle of grieving over again. Liberty is defined as the positive enjoyment of various social, political, or economic rights and privileges. In that context, liberty has not been afforded to all people. It is my hope that this offering lets us reflect as a community, and that we would change the minds and hearts of our neighbors and loved ones.

I have no idea what the next 120 years hold for us, but if we cannot bind the wounds together we will fail as a Union. This is not only our government's duty, but ours as citizens, dreamers, and artists. May these words and this music be medicine for our souls and the bitter taste of inequity be washed from our mouths. May love and understanding be guideposts along the journey of healing we all must take. May hope be the lantern that lights the way when it seems too dark to walk the path.
